What is the overall deductible? If you have other family members on the plan, each family member must meet their own individual deductible until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family deductible.
Are there services covered before you meet your deductible?	Yes. In-Network Preventive Health Care Services and certain services with a <u>copayment</u> are covered before you meet your deductible.	This plan covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the deductible amount. But a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply. For example, this plan covers certain <u>preventive services</u> without <u>cost-sharing</u> and before you meet your deductible. What is not included in the out-of-pocket limit?	Premiums, <u>balance-billing</u> charges, and health care this plan doesn't cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> .

Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes
